Statement of Concern No. 32207 Trident Exploration (Alberta) Corp. Applications No. 32159449, 32183465, 32183546 and 32183680

Dear Rene Boutin:

You are receiving this letter because you filed a statement of concern (SOC) about Applications No. 32159449, 32183465, 32183546 and 32183680. The Alberta Energy Regulator (AER) has reviewed your SOC, along with the applications, and all applicable requirements and other submissions or information about the applications. The AER has decided that a hearing is not required to consider the concerns outlined in your SOC.

In our review of your concerns, we considered the following:

- The subject applications are administrative in nature and involve updating the status of four pipeline licenses held by the insolvent licensee, Trident Exploration Corp. (Trident).
- The AER acknowledges your concern regarding unpaid municipal taxes. As per the recently issued Government of Alberta *Ministerial Order 043/2023*, this concern is not applicable with respect to the review of the subject pipeline applications.
- The subject applications have been reviewed in accordance with *Directive 056: Energy Development Applications and Schedules* requirements. The concerns related to unreasonable risk relate to *Directive 067: Eligibility Requirements for Acquiring and Holding Energy Licences and Approvals* and are out of scope for the subject applications.

Based on the above, the AER has concluded that it is not necessary to hold a hearing before making a decision on the applications. The AER has issued the applied-for licences, and this is your notice of that decision. A copy of the licences are attached.

All AER-regulated parties must comply not only with the conditions of their authorizations, but with all of the AER's regulatory requirements. To ensure industry compliance the AER has developed its *Integrated Compliance Assurance Framework*, which embodies the three main components of all effective compliance assurance programs, those being education, prevention, and enforcement. You may file a regulatory appeal on the AER's decision to issue the licences if you meet the criteria within section 36 of the *Responsible Energy Development Act*.
