## **APPENDIX**

### **REMOVING THE SOLUTION GAS FLARING LIMIT**

#### **DIRECTION**

WHEREAS the Minister of Environment and Protected Areas and the Minister of Energy and Minerals are authorized by section 67 of the *Responsible Energy Development Act* to give directions to the Alberta Energy Regulator (AER) for the purposes of

- a. providing priorities and guidelines for the AER to follow in carrying out its power, duties, and functions; and
- b. ensuring the work of the AER is consistent with the programs, policies, and work of the Government in respect of energy resource and mineral resource development, public land management, environmental management, and water management.

WHEREAS Directive 060 sets the Alberta solution gas flaring limit (SGFL) in Section 4.1.

WHEREAS removing the SGFL, while maintaining all other regulatory tools in Directive 060 with respect to flaring, will continue to protect Albertans from harmful emissions, conserve an economically valuable resource for Albertans, and identify opportunities for solution gas conservation and use.

THEREFORE, pursuant to section 67 of REDA, the Minister of Environment and Protected Areas hereby directs the AER to

#### **DIRECTION TO THE AER**

1. Remove the Alberta solution gas flaring limit from Directive 060 – Upstream Petroleum Industry Flaring, Incinerating and Venting (Section 4.1); and
2. Comply with the direction given under this Order by June 30, 2025.
