Re: Hearing Submission Schedule and Date for Proceedings 384 and 386

Dear Sirs and Madam:

The Alberta Energy Regulator (AER) panel of hearing commissioners for the above-noted proceedings (the panel) has asked that I communicate the following:

In its September 13, 2019 letter, the panel outlined a hearing process for proceedings 384 and 386 and requested Pure Environmental Waste Management Ltd.'s (Pure Environmental), Suncor Energy Inc.'s (Suncor) and the AER Authorizations Group's (AER Authorizations) preferred hearing dates from one of two proposed two-week periods between December 2019 and early February 2020. Neither of the proposed two-week periods were preferred options for all of these parties. Accordingly, the panel's counsel held a conference call with counsel for Pure Environmental, Suncor, and AER Authorizations to canvas availability for alternative hearing dates.

Alberta Agriculture and Forestry has been granted participation in proceeding 384. The representatives of Alberta Forestry did not provide information on hearing availability.

The panel has reviewed Pure Environmental's, Suncor's and AER Authorizations' scheduling information provided subsequent to the conference call and notes that these parties do not appear to be available for the same two-week period between November 18, 2019 to February 7, 2020 without potential conflicts or constraints. Notwithstanding participant availability challenges, the panel views efficiency and expeditiousness as an important element of a fair proceeding. Having regard for the information provided to the panel, it appears the last two weeks of November 2019 are the most appropriate weeks for the hearing ensuring that proceedings 384 and 386 move forward in a fair, efficient and expeditious manner.

The public hearing for proceeding 384 will begin on November 18, 2019 and the hearing for proceeding 386 will begin on November 25<sup>th</sup>, 2019. Both hearings will be held at Govier Hall, which is located on the third floor at 250-5<sup>th</sup> Street SW, Calgary, Alberta. The panel will determine the number of days required for each hearing after submissions have been filed.

The panel sets the following process deadlines for proceeding 384. Please note that submissions must be submitted to <a href="https://example.com/hearing.services@aer.ca">hearing.services@aer.ca</a> by 4 p.m. on the stated date. Submissions should be in PDF format, page numbered to match the PDF page number, bookmarked, and searchable (optical character recognition). Submissions must meet the requirements of section 9.2(2) of the Alberta Energy Regulator Rules of Practice (Rules of Practice).
