Dear Sir/Madam:

You are receiving this letter because you filed a statement of concern regarding application no. 1918761. The Alberta Energy Regulator (AER) has reviewed your statement of concern, along with the company's application, and all applicable requirements and other submissions or information about the application. The AER has decided that a hearing is not required to consider the concerns outlined in your statement of concern.

In our review of your concerns, we considered the following:

- West Lake operates numerous water disposal wells in the area including the A0/12-16-041-01W4/0 injector that is located only 0.28km from Sec 17-041-01W4 eastern boundary and is completed in the Dina A interval. The proposed un-drilled injector would be located at greater distance from producers operated by West Lake than existing injectors that West Lake operates itself.
- All salt water disposal wells (SWDs) operated by West Lake within Section 16, except for 1D0/06-16 SWD, are in much closer proximity to the active West Lake production than the proposed SWD and do not appear to adversely impact the offset producers.
- Rifle Shot Oil Corp. (RSO) is required to meet all environmental and regulatory guidelines and requirements.
- RSO committed to utilize the "water-leg" of the Dina formation to dispose of produced water for all section 17 water disposal wells.
- The proposed well will be part of an existing disposal scheme.

The AER has not yet made a decision on the Application and you will be notified when that decision is made. If a hearing on the application is to be held for another reason, a notice of hearing will be published.

All AER- regulated parties must comply with all of the AER's regulatory requirements. To ensure industry compliance the AER has developed its *Integrated Compliance Assurance Framework*, which embodies the three main components of all effective compliance assurance programs, those

You may file a regulatory appeal on the AER's decision if you meet the criteria within section 36 of the *Responsible Energy Development Act*. Filing instructions and forms are on our website under Regulatory Appeal Process.
