Dear Sir/Madam:

You are receiving this letter because you filed a statement of concern regarding application no. CEP190006. The Alberta Energy Regulator (AER) has reviewed your statement of concern, along with the company's application, and all applicable requirements and other submissions or information about the application. The AER has decided that a hearing is not required to consider the concerns outlined in your statement of concern.

In our review of your concerns, we considered the following:

- You do not own the land on which the proposed project will be located.
- The Coal Exploration Program (CEP) impacts are localized and temporary in nature. A letter of authority is issued for a five (5) year term; two (2) years for operations and three (3) years for reclamation.
- The project will be constructed and drilled for approximately two (2) weeks in December 2019 and two (2) weeks in summer 2020, weather dependent.
- The proposed project will have a 50m setback buffer zone from any watercourse. Three (3) stream crossings have been identified and temporary crossings will be constructed for access.

- Water monitoring programs are planned to minimize potential impacts on existing water systems, and the local environment. Appropriate water crossings will be used on any stream.
- Montem will adhere to all timeline restrictions imposed in the sensitive areas the proposed project falls within in, in relation to species at risk.
- Montem Resources is required to meet all environmental and regulatory requirements., including the *Code of Practice for Exploration Operations* and Directive SD 2010-01: Coal and Oil Sands Exploration Reclamation Requirements.
- You have not demonstrated that you may be directly and adversely impacted by the approval of the Application.

The AER has not yet made a decision on the Application and you will be notified when that decision is made. If a hearing on the application is to be held for another reason, a notice of hearing will be published.

All AER-regulated parties must comply not only with the conditions of their authorizations, but with all of the AER's regulatory requirements.
