

Adjustment to Well Scenario Declaration

Complete the declaration below to validate the Adjustment to Well Scenario submission data file. The Adjustment to Well Scenario data file is prepared by the licensee and identifies whether there is tubing and artificial lift¹ for all wells licensed to the licensee. A licensee can only submit an Adjustment to Well Scenario form for wells for which they are recognized as the licensee of record by the AER. This information will be used to recalculate the estimated well abandonment costs. This declaration must be completed by a senior corporate officer of the licensee (e.g., chief executive officer, chief operating officer, chief financial officer, president, etc.).

¹ Artificial lift is a process that uses, on wells, equipment that may include pumps and rods that apply a source of energy to help bring fluids to the surface. Artificial lift is referenced as tubing and rods in *Directive 011: Estimated Liability*.
